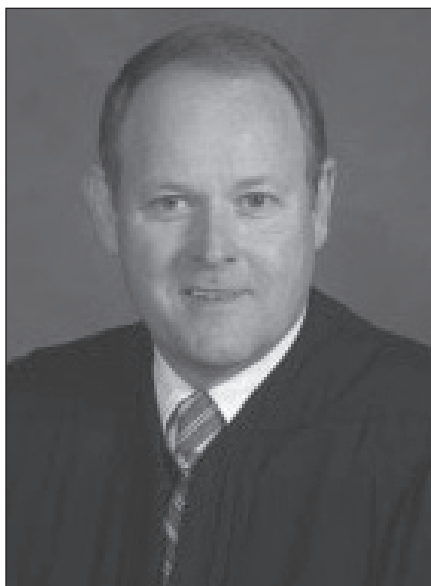
Circuit judge to speak at banquet

Brent Davis of Jonesboro, Iota Theta No. 424, circuit judge for the 2nd Judicial District of Arkansas, will be the featured speaker for the 56th annual Founders Day Banquet of Iota Theta Zeta. The event will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 25, in the Ballroom of the Cooper Alumni Center.

The banquet will highlight a full weekend of Lambda Chi Alpha activities.

Brother Davis, who just began his second 6-year term as circuit judge, previously served 16 years as prosecuting attorney for the 2nd Judicial District, which includes Craighead and five other counties of Northeast Arkansas. During his tenure he successfully prosecuted to a jury verdict more than 130 homicide cases, including three death verdict cases.

He graduated from Jonesboro High School in 1974, then earned a bachelor of science degree in political science at Arkansas State University in 1978 and a law degree from the University of Arkansas

(Fayetteville) in 1981.

He then practiced law in Jonesboro and became a partner in the firm of Henry, Walden and Davis, also serving for a

time as deputy prosecutor for Craighead County before running for and winning the prosecutor's office in 1992. He is a past president of the Arkansas Prosecuting Attorneys Association.

At ASU he pledged Lambda Chi Alpha and was initiated in January 1975. Although age 59, he claimed still to be able to recite the 12 ideals and the Greek alphabet.

He is married to Terry (King) Davis, who was a member of Alpha Omicron Pi sorority at ASU.

In his spare time he enjoys fishing, turkey hunting, bow hunting, reading and spectator sports.

This will be the first Founders Day banquet held in the Cooper Center, which was completed in 2008. It's a multi-purpose facility covering about 20,000 square feet and stands on the site where many alumni will remember the "old pavilion" was. A new pavilion is

High Alpha's report

"Ever growing" is a phrase we are all familiar with and is also the best way I can describe the current state of our chapter here at Arkansas State University. From my freshman year in 2011 to my senior year here in 2015, the amount of growth I've seen in our chapter is unreal. The house itself is in the best shape I have seen it. Whether it be the outside on the lawn and bushes or inside with our newly installed floor in our meeting room, it always seems to be improving in some form or fashion. The growth is not just structural or in number, but internal as well. If I hadn't been given a bid here, I'm not sure where I'd be with myself today. I cannot say enough of how much this place has given to me as a man. The life lessons and maturity I have gained here are priceless, and I cannot wait to pass these on to undergraduates when I become an alumnus.

My time as president has been the most influential and life-changing experience. I would have never thought this office could give so much to me. The office has not been a cake walk, but I feel like I am a better man because of the experience. This fall we initiated 16 great men into our fraternity and added them to our brotherhood. I can assure you that these men are of the highest quality and were selected through a rigorous bid session. The overall GPA for this class was a 3.1,

and the ACT average was 28. As for the chapter, the overall GPA was a 3.01, and the officers' cumulative GPA was a 3.4.

The chapter has achieved many things this past year. To begin with, the associate class won our eighth straight Best Men on Campus award this fall! The chapter this year was able to gather up 25,000 pounds of canned food for Feeding America (our national philanthropy) and raised an additional \$9,000 in proceeds for Feeding America as well. For each dollar we raise, 10 pounds of food are donated. As a chapter, we placed in the top eight chapters in the nation for total amount of food raised for Feeding America and have been recognized by our very own International Headquarters!

One of our very own members, Carter Lee, served on the International Ritual Team and was our first participant in a number of decades. He also now serves on the International Committee on Emblems and Rituals. We continue to remain a strong presence within Greek life, and we have brothers involved in nearly every area on campus. We currently have two brothers who serve within the Student Government Association, two officers on IFC (including president!), and three officers on the St. Jude Executive Council! We have brothers who serve in many different officer positions throughout cam-

pus, and one brother, Caleb Garrett, even co-founded the Special Olympics College here at the university — the first chapter of this organization in the state.

We have had consecutive successful visits from our educational leader consultant in which we have met the 12 operation standards. This elevates us to receive new programming and become part of a select few chapters to receive this programming nationally. The chapter officers also received the highest ratings from the ELC visit that we've ever had with more than five of the 13 getting an Excellent rating, the highest possible. We also had our second annual White Rose Formal in Nashville at The Grand Opry Hotel and downtown Nashville. We had a very successful trip!

As we as a chapter continue this semester, we are reminded just what kind of a brotherhood we have here and what a special bond we share. The possibilities are endless and "ever growing" for us here at Iota Theta Zeta. The sky is the limit for what we can do as a chapter and for the community! I can only see the fraternity advancing and operating at an even higher level in the future. The future is bright here at Iota Theta, and we will continue to be a light for this campus for years to come.

Jeff and Lisa Simmons, longtime supporters of Arkansas State University and owners of a couple of local businesses, have endowed two scholarships to the College of Business and the College of Fine Arts.

The two scholarships, known as the Simmons Family Scholarship and the Simmons Family Endowed Scholarship, combine to total \$30,000 that will provide an annual award based on endowment earnings each year. It will rotate annually between the Accounting Department and the choral music section headed by Dr. Dale Miller.

Upon the retirement of Miller from Arkansas State, the scholarship is designated entirely for the Accounting Department.

Jeff and Lisa own Crown Trophy, a local store specializing in promotional products, specialty items, trophies, plaques, medals and other awards. Jeff, Iota Theta No. 703, is a member of the Board of Directors of LXA at ASU Inc.

Criteria for the College of Business Accounting scholarship include being a fulltime student in good standing, a junior or senior level student, must have a grade point average of 2.5 or better and must be an accounting major in the College of Business.

For the Fine Arts Choral scholarship, a recipient must adhere to the same criteria. In addition, the award goes to a non-music major who performs in the chamber choir or in any chorus for Arkansas State.

40 take part in Old-Timers Reunion

Forty alumni of Iota Theta Zeta at Arkansas State University participated in an “Old-Timers Reunion” at Heber Springs Sept. 26-28, 2014.

The “old-timers” attending were among the first 300 men initiated into the chapter. Those taking part ranged from Zeta No. 1 Jim Wimberly to Zeta No. 282 Bill Phillips. Brothers with zeta numbers up to 400 were invited.

Jeff Clayton, Iota Theta No. 610, attended as a representative of the house corporation, Lambda Chi Alpha at ASU Inc.

Counting spouses, 70 people participated. The Red Apple Inn on Eden Isle served as reunion headquarters.

The weekend began with a Friday night seafood buffet at the Cafe Klasser, just east of Heber Springs and on the Red River. Fifty people attended.
